

## Semester evaluations, Study Board for Cross-Cultural Studies (CCG and Tourism), Spring 2017

### Tourism-Copenhagen

Unfortunately the response rate is not fully satisfactory. Out of a total of 116 students only 47 filled out the survey. This is a response rate on 41% - however, this includes both 8. Semester students (26) and 10. Semester students (21).

The time spend on studies is slightly below the satisfactory level. 18% state they spend 40+ hours, 32% between 30-40 hours but 42% between 20-30 hours. Almost no one spend less time than this which is an improvement from the year before. We continue initiatives to increase the level of study engagement. The self-perception of work efforts oppositely show that 27% completely agree that their efforts were satisfactory and 42% agree in this statement.

The respondents are somewhat divided between feeling well-informed about coherence between study activities in the semester (51%; 16% neither agrees or disagrees and 29% disagree or completely disagree), of the programme modules (67%) and find that the academic benefit (56%). These numbers causes some concern but as we have introduced a new curriculum, we hope that this will help on improving the satisfaction.

A majority of the respondents took part in group work while writing projects (93%). However as the number covers both 8. Semester and 10. Semester students it is difficult to say much about project work as most 10. Semester students write individually. A large majority also states that the group work went well (22% completely agree and 67% agree – but 8 students in total). 26% completed the project in cooperation with an external collaborator.

4 students took a study visit abroad. 3 of them would recommend other students to do so as well.

59% completely agrees or agrees to feeling well-informed about practical issues, 14% disagree to this fact.

The opinion of the physical conditions have improved. Now only 14% find them to be not satisfactory or average (34%) satisfactory.

It is satisfactory to see that 73% agree or completely agree on experiencing a well functioning study community and even more so that 78% agree or completely agree to thriving on their education. Only one student answer negatively.
