

Report on course evaluations for Tourism Copenhagen, Autumn 2019.

The evaluation form was distributed to 63, 7th semester students and for some reason 51 have responded (to be defined as 100% in the evaluations which are not correct, then)

The 51 students have completed at least some parts.

Approximately half the students opted for the specialization: Global Tourism Development

Consumer

Half the students feel they know about the learning goals and spent more than 10 hours a week on preparing for class

The majority were satisfied with the extent and level of the course, and 82 % saying the level was appropriate. Overall the students agreed that the course gave a good learning outcome in proportion to the learning outcomes, and agreed or completely agreed that the course material supported their learning process. In general, the students found the sessions interesting and enjoyed working with case studies and to conduct fieldwork.

Tourism destination analysis

The majority of the respondents agree to know the learning objectives of this course and have spent more than 10 hours a week working with the course material. The majority also considered the level appropriate and were positive about the extent of the course. All but 3 of the respondents agreed or completely agreed that the course gave me a good learning outcome in proportion to the learning objectives. The comments on this course are in general positive and thought the course provided a good understanding of tourism systems. They enjoyed the collaboration with Ørestaden but also found it challenging. They had some issues with the exam date which was moved a couple of times.

Encounters: sociological and anthropological approaches to tourism

As with the other courses, the majority of students responded that they knew the learning objectives. They spent 7-9 hours preparing for class. Again, they were satisfied overall with the content, and at an appropriate level and the extent was appropriate. The comments are in general positive and indicate that the material covered in the course is relevant and interesting.

Project based learning and Project writing

In general, the students said they knew the learning objectives for the course and that the level was appropriate and they spent from 4 to ten hours preparing for the lectures. The majority agreed or completely agreed that the course gave them a good learning outcome. The comments indicate that some students found this course difficult probably due to the students' variation in disciplinary backgrounds.

Global Tourism Development

The students agree they knew the learning objectives of the course; and the level was appropriate. Overall the students agreed that the course gave a good learning outcome in proportion to the learning outcomes, and agreed or completely agreed that the course material supported their learning process. They spent 7-9 hours on the course readings.

In general, the students found the sessions interesting, contemporary and created awareness.

A general comment to all classes: is that they students would like more lectures, that 8 weeks is too little considering it being their first semester at their master level.
